1.4.1	CIC/CRB/P/002/15 (Progress Report)	<u>Workers Registration Offices</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As of 31 Dec 2014, total number of workers with valid registration was 341,634. • In view of positive response from the industry, Workers Registration Office in Kowloon Bay would continue to provide same day service for registration renewal to workers who completed and passed CIC safety training course (Green Card).
1.4.3	CIC/CRB/P/004/15 (for Resolution)	<u>Sub-committee on Senior Workers Assessment</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After the amendment bill passed its third reading in LegCo, 3 trade unions authorised to provide pre-assessment to senior workers received numerous enquiries and applications. • Senior workers who are able to provide proof of at least a total of 10 years' work experience in specified trade divisions (Master) are qualified to apply for registration as skilled workers of specified trade divisions (Master). • Applicants of senior workers registration will not be allowed to apply for registration as skilled workers of more than one trade division with work experience gained in the same period.

Further review and revision would be carried out based on the results of the trial.

1.4.6	CIC/CRB/P/007/15 (Progress Report)	<p data-bbox="719 823 1576 857"><u>Task Force on Construction Workers Registration System</u></p> <ul data-bbox="719 869 2045 1273" style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="719 869 2045 944">• Starting from early 2015, WROs enable workers to collect new registration cards on the same day after the application is approved. <li data-bbox="719 952 2045 1027">• “Working Group of CWRS User Acceptance Test and Pilot Run” was formed to oversee the testing process of CWRS. <li data-bbox="719 1035 2045 1150">• To reduce the impact on the majority of contractors and workers during the transition period, WRO will strive to shorten the time to one year to replace new registration cards for all registered workers. <li data-bbox="719 1158 2045 1273">• To provide contractors with sufficient time to enhance the system and to conduct on-site testing, the launch of CWRS and new workers registration card will be postponed to end of 2015.
