3.1	CIC/CTB/R/002/15	Confirmation of Progress Report of the last meeting
		Members confirmed the revised Progress Report of the 2nd CITB meeting held on 10 February 2015.
3.2	CIC/CTB/R/002/15	Matters arising from the last meeting Members noted that VTC had drafted the course syllabus for part-time day-release DVE (non-PPE disciplines) in relation to the professional development and progression pathways for construction practitioners who started their career after leaving Secondary 3 or as semi-skilled workers. The CIC would continue to follow up the detailed arrangement of the course. In addition, CIC also contacted Buildings Department regarding the adjustment of the contents of Construction Supervisor/Technician Training Programme for the qualification equivalent to a T1 course or to get exemption from taking some modules of a T1 course.
3.3	CIC/CTB/P/021/15	Advanced Construction Manpower Training Scheme – Pilot Scheme
	(for discussion)	Members accepted the captioned Pilot Scheme including the "Skills Enhancement Programme–Pilot Scheme" in collaboration with labour unions, the target of 1,000 training places and the related estimated expenditure of about \$217 million, which would be submitted to Committee on Administration and Finance. The said scheme would serve as the blueprint for advanced cooperative training for other suitable trades. Management would continue to discuss with industry stakeholders about the comments made by Members and other details.
3.4	CIC/CTB/P/022/15	Proposed revision to trades under Enhanced Construction Manpower Training Scheme (ECMTS)
	(for discussion)	Members agreed to re-list Tower Crane Worker's Assistant as the specified trade under ECMTS. Two related courses, namely Tower Crane Worker's Assistant and Tower Crane (Erecting, Dismantling, Telescoping & Climbing) Worker's Assistant, would then be re-listed as short courses under ECMTS and as ECMTS trades under cooperative training schemes with daily trainee allowance being adjusted to \$320.
3.5	CIC/CTB/P/023/15	Benchmarks for cost-effectiveness of full-time courses and cooperative training schemes
	(for discussion)	Members accepted eight benchmarks for effectiveness of full-time courses and cooperative training schemes, and the preliminary statistics. Chairman suggested reviewing the effectiveness with reference to two benchmarks each time in the initial stage.
3.6	CIC/CTB/P/024/15	Proposal of splitting up Metal Formwork and Concreting Course
	(for discussion)	Members approved splitting up the above course into two ECMTS courses, namely Metal Formwork Erector Course and Concreting Course, the required capital expenditure of \$100,000 for operating the Concreting Course and the additional expenditure of around \$1.74 million.
