		• To ensure effective endorsement and assessment of the working experience of qualified workers, all approved construction-related trade unions are required to submit the total years of establishment, membership list of the assessment committee and information of other authorised persons;			
		• In the circumstance where the trade union is required to endorse the working experience which exceeded its total years of establishment, the application must be co-signed by a member or secretariat officer who possesses over ten years' working experience in the construction industry; and			
		• Direct employer, being a member of any specified trade association, can endorse the workers' working experience for not more than the years of establishment of the company.

	(for Resolution)	The following items were endorsed:			
		• "Tree Worker" would not be created at the present stage. It was suggested that follow-up			

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		 action with the industry must be continued to explore a suitable time to add the trade; Applicants with provisional registration applying for normal registration or addition of trades, and possess a registration card with 7-12 months' validity can pay the renewal fee in advance to save time visiting the Workers Registration Offices again; and Gained from the experience in the 1st round of outreach service for registration renewal, the Secretariat would consider adjusting the working hours to enable frontline staff to match the working hours with the construction sites to enhance the effectiveness. 			
5.3.6	CIC/CRB/P/036/14 (Progress Report)	 Task Force on Data Analysis Members took note of the following issues: The 3rd round of telephone survey was conducted in June - August 2014. Data analysis report would be uploaded to CIC website in November for the reference of the public; Average number of working days and working days with attendance record per week for workers with DAR > 0 had dropped as compared with the results of two previous surveys; Up to 30 June 2014, it was estimated that 219,433 workers were currently engaging in the construction industry and 166,235 workers appeared at construction works on any given day (truck drivers and workers carrying out non-construction works were excluded); and A consultancy firm was commissioned to review the research objectives, methodology, procedure of the telephone survey as well as to provide comments and opinions.

Based on the comments from task force members, the Secretariat would continue preparing the booklet of "Designated Workers for Designated Skills".

The device would be provided to contractors participating in the pilot test in March 2015 in construction sites of various sizes; and The Task Force was considering a flexible approach by leasing the card reading device.
