	(for information)	<ul> <li>(a) The Secretariat has summarised the comments of the CWRB at the first meeting in 2020 and drafted a framework for promulgation of monthly pay for partial construction workers as well as a standard employment contract template for Members' deliberation.</li> <li>(b) It is recommended that the basic salary of the monthly pay is defined in accordance with the definition of "continuous contract of employment" under the Employment Ordinance (Cap. 57). If an employee works outside of the basic salary working hours, the employer shall pay overtime. The total income of a worker shall be similar to the current earnings of the worker under daily pay. Workers can work part-time in other companies during working hours other than the basic salary working hours.</li> <li>(c) Regarding the promulgation plan, the CIC is working with the Development Bureau to run pilot scheme with public works term maintenance contracts. Afterwards, the same will be promulgated to other public bodies.</li> </ul>

The issuance was postponed due to COVID-19 epidemic. Since the epidemic situation will likely fluctuate in the foreseeable future, Members approved to launch the credit card in September.</li> <li>(b) CCB sales team will visit the CIC Service Centres, individual construction companies and construction sites to promote the credit card to workers.</li> <li>(c) As a normal co-brand card arrangement, CCB invited CIC affiliated individuals to be the first batch of applicants to the credit card.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

A total of 1,241 workers' daily attendance records were checked.</li> <li>(b) A total of 107 prosecution summonses were issued in the first two quarters of 2020.</li> <li>(c) In the first two quarters of 2020, a total of 10 seminars on "Designated Workers for Designated Skills" and "Construction Workers Registration System" were held. A total of 134 industry practitioners attended.</li> </ul>
