1.10		Any Other Business (i) Representative from EPD briefed Members on the update progress of the pilot scheme of application of GPS installed on dump trucks to monitor the movement of construction waste. They are exploring the mandatory use of positioning technology to enhance the control of fly-tipping of construction waste. (ii) Members discussed how the industry can promote and adopt more on innovation and technology. (iii) Members were briefed on the update progress of the CIC Green Carbon Labelling Scheme for Construction Products. Carbon Auditor Training Courses and Promotion of the Scheme will be planned for year 2016. (iv) Members took note on the renamed of the Committee as "Committee on Environment"
		after gaining approval from Council scheduled on 29 April 2016.
