Yet, follow-up should be taken to provide a better articulation to these candidates who would not have to re-take the test and to save the administrative work and cost of CIC. |
| 11.5 | | A new round of publicity campaign for boosting the number of candidates for trade tests Members noted that apart from the publicity channels used currently, a new round of publicity campaign would focus on three publicity activities, which included strengthening promotion through outdoor media, increasing promotional activities targeted at ethnic minorities, and enhancing the image of trade testing. |

It was also noted that the structured on-the-job training and skills enhancement courses under Advanced Construction Manpower Training Scheme received 170 and 78 applications respectively during the period from 1 September 2015 to 30 November 2015. |
