Chapter 1 – Proposed nomination arrangements

- Members need to <u>elect Chairmen of CIC</u> <u>Committees according to open, fair and just</u> <u>principles</u>
- Subject to Members agreement, we will also take into account of practices in other relevant elections.
- The Chairmen of Committees can at the earliest, be elected and endorsed at the 2nd CIC meeting. The Committees can then be formed asap thereafter

Nominations will need to be invited

- <u>A valid nomination must be made in the written</u> form and contain:
 - Name of the Committee concerned
 - Name of Member being nominated (the candidate) and his/her <u>signature to confirm acceptance of</u> <u>nomination</u>
 - <u>Names and signatures of 2 Members</u> (which may include the candidate himself/herself) subscribing to the nomination.
 - Each Member can only subscribe to one candidate for each Committee

A nomination form (at Annex) should be submitted

• to the Returning Officer (RO), i.e. Mr Jack Chan [PAS(W)1], or

the Assistant Returning Officer (ARO), i.e. Ms Cindy Kwan [AS(PD)]

- at their office on 11th floor, Murray Building by fax or by post
- Completed nomination forms must be received <u>during the</u> <u>specified nomination period</u>, i.e.
 - from 12 March (Monday) to 17 March (Saturday)
 - 9 am to 5 pm on Monday to Friday, and 9 am to 12 noon on Saturday

- After the close of nomination period, RO will prepare and dispatch a <u>summary of nominations</u> <u>received</u> to Members under confidential cover before the 2nd meeting (or at the earliest)
- <u>If uncontested</u>, RO will announce that Member be elected as Chairman of the Committee concerned.
- <u>If contested</u>, RO will preside the voting to be conducted at the 2nd meeting

Chapter 2 - Proposed Voting Arrangements

- If a post is contested, it is suggested that <u>voting</u> <u>by secret ballot</u> be conducted at the 2nd meeting.
- The CIC Chairman and Members present at the meeting may vote by marking the ballot paper with <u>a single tick (✓) in the box</u> opposite the name of the candidate of his/her choice.

Proposed Voting System for a Contested Election

- RO will conduct the count.
- A candidate will be elected if he obtains more than half of the total number (i.e. the absolute majority) of valid votes at the first round of the election.
- Otherwise, subsequent rounds of voting be conducted by eliminating the candidate with the lowest number of votes until a candidate is elected.

Chapter 3 – Endorsement of Election Results by CIC

- The RO will announce the candidates elected at the meeting.
- The election results will be endorsed by the CIC at the meeting.
