	(for information)	Members took note of the report on SRS Operations. There were 6,031 companies registered under the SRS with an increase of around 58 Registered Subcontractors compared to that of the last report in August 2018. A total of 138 regulatory actions had been taken against subcontractors mainly for late payments of workers' wages, MPF contributions and contraventions of safety regulations involved fatality.
		The SRS Leadership Summit were held on 12 November 2018 with a view on collaboration contracting, application of Building Information Modelling and innovation technology together with promotion on Construction Innovation and Technology Fund and SRS 2.0 with a total of 154 participants attended.
4.5	-	Presentation on Preliminary Strategies on Improving Time, Cost and Quality(TCQ) Performance of the Hong Kong Construction Industry  Mr. Mark ASHTON from Advisian briefed Members on the Preliminary Strategies on Improving Time, Cost and Quality (TCQ) Performance of the Hong Kong Construction Industry with elaboration on the study background and five recommendations on procurement. Members took note and were invited to deliberate on the topics.
