

The contract would be awarded to the supplier, Proteck Engineering Limited, which had the highest marks in both the technical and fee proposals to provide and deliver 3 sets of brand new loadshifting machinery simulators. (Post-meeting note: further to the discussion between the management and the supplier, it was noted that the cost for purchasing 3 loadshifting machinery simulators was around HK\$3.2M (the total cost for purchasing 9 loadshifting machinery simulators was around HK\$5.1M). The management concluded that the price was over the expectation, so no simulator would be procured at this moment.
