		Ar. Ada FUNG welcomed Mr. K. K. CHAN, CIC Chairman to attend the meeting.
4.1	CIC/BIM/M/003/21	<b>Confirmation of Minutes of the Previous Meeting</b> Members confirmed the Minutes of the meeting held on 30 September 2021.
4.2	CIC/BIM/M/003/21	Matters Arising from the Previous Meeting Members received the progress report on matters arising from the previous meeting, circulated on 7 December 2021 and highlighted as follows, with no further comments: Item 3.3 on the "BIM-Automation of Gross Floor Area (GFA) Calculation, Fire Safety and Prescribed Checking for General Building Plans (GBP) Preparation" Research Project – the CIC Secretariat promoted the research deliverables (the "tool") to the Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong (REDA) through meeting on 8 October 2021, and promoted the tool to the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS) and Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA) through webinars on 18 November and 25 November 2021 respectively. A webinar for launching of the tool would be held on 22 December 2021. The

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		tool has been included in the CITF pre-approved list of BIM software.
		Item 3.4 on the CIC BIM Guide for Using BIM in Generation of Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing (MEP) Digital Drawings for Statutory Submissions – the CIC Secretariat invited the Hong Kong Federation of Electrical and Mechanical Contractors Limited (HKFEMC) to attend briefing sessions on 29 November, 1 December and 6 December 2021. Online training materials would be developed from the content of the training workshops for practitioners to learn anytime anywhere.
		Item 3.11 on exploring the inclusion of BIM as contractual documents under Development Bureau (DEVB)'s contracts - DEVB was reviewing the relevant conditions of contract and conditions of tender for public works, aiming at binding the adoption of BIM models contractually. After incorporating the comments from works departments, DEVB would arrange legal vetting of the revised contract documents before consulting construction industry stakeholders around mid-2022. A number of pilot projects would be arranged for trial afterwards.
4.3	CIC/BIM/P/027/21 (for approval)	Applications for the CIC R&D Fund The CIC received 11 research proposals related to BIM in 2020-2021. It was a new policy that all these research proposals should be cleared by the end of each year. Based on the three key criteria (value of research, cost-effectiveness and research implementation) as stipulated in the CIC Research Policy, two research projects were approved in the past and no research proposal was recommended by the CIC Secretariat in this paper upon initial assessment. Members approved the initial assessment of the research proposals received.
