		Members confirmed the minutes of Meeting No. 001/25.

		Members took note of the progress on the matters arising from the previous meeting.
2.3	CIC/CRB/P/006/25 (for information)	Brainstorm Insights from Registered Worker's Attendance Record
		Members suggested improving workers' work hours and productivity in respect of site facilities for workers, workers training, publicity and education, and technology application. Salient points discussed were as follows:
		(a) To alleviate workers' efforts spent on transport works by wider technology application such as adoption of transport robots on construction sites so that workers could focus on skilled works and increased work hours accordingly.

		(b) To improve overall logistics of construction sites such as optimizing and increasing the use of builder lifts and material hoists to improve efficiency and workers' site facilities;
		(c) To explore the setting of standard work hours by trade so as to enhance workers' professionalism;
		(d) To promote enhancement of site facilities for workers.

	,	Members endorsed the CWRB 2026 KPIs, Business Plan and Budget. Highlights are as follows:
		(a) Organize staff development award (tentative name) with award ceremony to commend employers who actively promote workers' development through upskilling and technological advancement, such as implementing automated equipment or robotics.
		(b) Organize Scholarship for Family Members of Registered Construction Workers with an estimated 40 awards to be presented;
		(c) Organize Construction Workers Festival activities, inclusive a carnival to be held at the end of the year.
		(d) Engage professional data modelling consultant to build statistical models for data analysis of registered construction workers based on demand for analytics to solidify relevant analysis.

	(for approval)	Miss Virgina Shum, representing the Hong Kong Construction Sub-Contractors Association resigned as a member of the Sub-committee on Workers Development and Welfare due to her personal accord. Members approved the appointment of Mr. HUNG Sing Yeung from the Hong Kong Construction Sub-Contractors Association to replace Miss Virgina Sum as a member of the Sub-committee on Workers Development with term of office from 18 June 2025 until 30 June 2026.
2.6	CIC/CRB/P/009/25 (for approval)	Proposal for the Nominating Organizations for the Members of the Construction Workers Qualifications Board
		(a) The Construction Workers Qualification Board is a statutory committee appointed by CWRB in accordance with the Construction Workers Registration Ordinance (CWRO). According to the composition specified in the CWRO, the CWRB established a list of nominating organisations. Those organisations would be invited to nominate members for the consideration of CWRB on rotation basis.
		(b) Members approved to invite the City University of Hong Kong, the Airport Authority, the Hong Kong Construction Association and the Hong Kong Construction Industry Employees General Union to nominate Members to succeed the seats of retiring members at end of the year. The term of office will be two years, from 1 January 2026 to 31 December 2027.

		(a) From January to April 2025, a total of 556 inspections on construction sites were conducted and a total of 720 Daily Attendance Records (DARs) were checked.
		(b) From January to April 2025, a total of 63 summonses were issued. 37 summonses resulted in convictions in court (included those summonses issued in 2024 or before).
		(c) From January to April 2025, a total of four seminars on "Designated Workers for Designated Skills" and "Construction Workers Registration System (CWRS)" were held to explain the requirements of the Construction Workers Registration Ordinance, introduce the CWRS and provide operational demonstration.
