		(c) The Secretariat will follow up with the Development Bureau to publish the appointment in the Gazette according to the requirement of the CWRO.
3.4	CIC/CRB/P/012/25 (for information)	Report of Sub-Committee on Workers Development and Welfare Meeting No. 002/25
		(a) Construction Workers Professional Development Scheme encourages general workers to obtain semi-skilled/skilled worker qualifications and supports semi-skilled workers in advancing to skilled workers, with a cash prize as an incentive. As of end-August 2025, a total of 546 workers received awards.
		(b) As of the end of August 2025, a total of 5,377 workers have participated in the Medical Examination Scheme for Registered Construction Workers (MES). As worker's health is critical to both their well-being and site safety, the CWRB has decided to reallocate the residual budget after taking the sponsorship received for other schemes into consideration, to increase the target of MES services from 5,000 to 6,000 worker. The CWRB will continue promoting the MES to encourage worker participation. If the number of participants exceeds 6,000, further reallocation of Council budget will be arranged where appropriate.
		(c) As of mid-September 2025, a total of 404 construction sites were awarded the Worker-Friendly Construction Site logo. The CWRB will continue promoting site tidiness and provision of appropriate facilities for workers through the campaign.

		(d) Activities to be held in the fourth quarter of this year include the 4S Technology Guided Tour, a visit to the Centre for Future Construction and Award ceremony for Scholarship for Family Members of Registered Construction Workers 2025.

	(Tot miormason)	(a) As of July 2025, according to data expansion analysis, there were a total of 399,000 registered workers engaged in the construction industry.
		(b) The statistics from the Census and Statistics Department indicated that the gross value of constructions works in 2024-25 show a slight increase, with growth mainly driven by public works projects. Private sector construction output had declined.

	(for information)	(a) From January to August 2025, a total of 1,114 construction site inspections and a total of 1,422 workers' daily attendance records (DAR) were checked.
		(b) From January to August 2025, a total of 125 summonses were issued. 88 summonses were resulted in convictions in court (including those summonses issued in 2024).
		(c) From January to August 2025, 11 webinars on "Designated Workers for Designated Skills" and "Construction Workers Registration System" (CWRS) were held to explain
