2.7	CIC/CRB/P/008/21 (for endorsement)	<p><b>Budget and work plan of the CWRB for 2022</b> Members endorsed the budget and work plan of the CWRB for 2022. Highlights of the work plan for 2022 included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Operate the new Kowloon Bay Service Centre and Nam Cheong Service Centre; 36,000 new applications, 85,800 renewal applications, and 28,800 applications for updating information were estimated;</li> <li>(ii) Provide one-stop-service to process applications for CIC training courses and trade tests; a total of 32,000 applications were estimated;</li> <li>(iii) Conduct regular and ad hoc site inspections and compliance check on submissions of daily attendance records (DAR) according to the established guidelines, investigate and prosecute offences committed against the requirements of the CWRO according to the established enforcement guidelines and prosecution policy, and actively educate and promote the requirements of the CWRB to the industry;</li> <li>(iv) Organise and promote the Construction Workers Festival 2022;</li> </ul>

2.8	CIC/CRB/P/009/21 (for information)	<p><b>Report on the Meeting No. 001/21 of Sub-committee on Workers Development and Welfare</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) The Construction Workers Festival 2021 is themed on professional development and healthy living. Webinars on physical and psychological health will be organised in June and August 2021. Partnering with Construction Month, physical seminars on health and professional development as well as family fun activities will be held in November.</li> <li>(b) Promotion has been conducted through the CIC Service Centres, the Construction Workers Festival website, SMS and instant messaging app. In addition, promotional posters were sent to trade associations, trade unions and contractors.</li> <li>(c) In order to engage industry stakeholders to participate in the meaningful Scholarship for Family Members of Registered Construction Workers as well as fulfil their social responsibilities and demonstrate good corporate governance, a sponsorship programme was introduced this year. A total of HK\$145,000 in sponsorship were received as of 31 May 2021.</li> </ul>

		<p>(a) Total number of registered workers as at 30 April 2021 was 568,536, comprising 208,753 registered skilled workers, 33,415 registered semi-skilled workers and 326,368 registered general workers.</p> <p>(b) Site works to design and build the new Kowloon Bay Service Centre started in June 2021 and target to be completed in August 2021. Tsing Yi Service Centre will be in operation until 13 August 2021. The relevant publicity has been launched.</p>
2.10	CIC/CRB/P/011/21 (for information)	<p><b>Report on Inspection and Enforcement</b></p> <p>(a) From January to April 2021, a total of 454 construction sites and 4,455 workers registration cards were inspected according to the CWRO. A total of 774 daily attendance record submissions were checked.</p> <p>(b) From February to April 2021, over 800 construction sites were inspected for “Regular Testing at Sites”.</p> <p>(c) A total of 113 prosecution summonses were issued from January to April 2021.</p> <p>(d) From January to April 2021, 222 summonses were convicted by the court (including summonses issued in or before 2021).</p> <p>(e) From January to April 2021, a total of 6 seminars on “Designated Workers for Designated Skills” and “Construction Workers Registration System” were held.</p>
