		In the first half of 2025, the MLS Department organised technical exchanges and visits on a range of themes, including the diversification of BIM suppliers, intelligent manufacturing of "Good Houses, green construction productivity, the low-altitude economy, and robotics". In particular, efforts were paid to actively promote the establishment of connections between industry stakeholders and domestic BIM manufacturers, as well as to foster collaboration in Hong Kong. By the day of the meeting, more than 15 companies, including the main contractors, consultants, and universities had initiated discussions with mainland BIM software vendors about collaboration opportunities. Members took note of the 2025 business plan of the MLS Department and the progress of KPIs.
