**Committee on Mainland Affairs**  
**Summary of Meeting No. 004/25**

**Key Highlights**

1. As of 4 December 2025, the MLS Department organised a total of 48 activities related to mainland affairs, including 32 meetings and exchanges, 13 technical visits, one mainland recruitment fair and two National Affairs Course. The overall satisfaction rate of the activities reached 96.6%. The 3<sup>rd</sup> China Mainland Construction Technology Booklets was issued.
2. The business plans related to “technical visits”, “business matching sessions”, and “issuing the “China Mainland Construction Technology Booklets” in the Com-MA 2025 KPIs have been completed ahead of schedule. Other business plans are proceeding as planned as normal, and will be completed on schedule.
3. Matters Arising from the Previous Meeting: The Com-MA secretariat has consolidated the contributions from members regarding Hong Kong’s construction industry and its potential to harness the advantages of “connecting with the mainland and the world”. This includes initiatives to establish MiC/MiMEP as a prominent Hong Kong brand and collaborate with Mainland supply chains to explore overseas markets, addressing the challenges faced by the industry. A proposal outlining the future development of the Committee on Mainland Affairs has been drafted based on these recommendations and submitted for management’s consideration.
4. To fully leverage the Mainland’s advantages in construction technology, scale, cost efficiency, and productivity, and to capitalise on Hong Kong’s distinctive positioning of backed by the Motherland and connected to the world, the Council and the CCPIT will, in the spirit of equality, mutual benefit and shared development, strengthen collaboration in areas such as joint expansion of overseas markets, promotion of supply chain platform development, enhancement of industry exchanges and cooperation, and reinforcement of information sharing and communication. These efforts aim to facilitate the joint participation of Chinese Mainland and Hong Kong construction enterprises in overseas development and to enhance the industry’s international competitiveness.
5. It was suggested that an offline seminar be organised in early 2026 for members of the Com-MA to gather views from different professional sectors. The seminar would enable in-depth discussions on topics such as “Sailing together to go global” strategies, with a view to formulating a more targeted and effective work plan and visit arrangements for 2026.
