# Construction Industry Council Publishes "Safety Alert No. 001/12 on Water Pipe Laying Works – Pressure Test (Road Works)"

Hong Kong • 29 August 2012 – The Construction Industry Council (CIC) today released a new publication entitled "Safety Alert No. 001/12 on Water Pipe Laying Works – Pressure Test (Road Works)" (Alert). The Alert is aimed at minimising the chance of accidents when workers lay underground water pipes or carry out related construction works that require excavation and pipe pressure tests.

#### Introduction

As a staunch advocate of construction safety, the CIC feels an obligation to address the potential hazards of water pipe laying projects that require excavation and pipe pressure tests. The Informal Task Force on Site Safety Incidents (Informal Task Force) of the CIC's Committee on Construction Site Safety (Com-CSS) therefore started work on drafting a safety alert with recommendations on safety precautionary measures.

#### **Publication**

Chairman of the Com-CSS, Mr. CHEUNG Hau-wai said, "the Alert is aimed at promoting good practices so as to reduce the chance of accidents when workers carry out water pipe laying works". A comment echoed by Mr. Victor KWONG, Chairman of the Informal Task Force, who reminded industry practitioners to take all necessary safety measures while engaging in such activities.
