Construction Industry Council Launches Construction Innovation & Technology Application Centre

To introduce world-class construction technologies

Hong Kong • **29 November 2017** – The Construction Industry Council (CIC) today announced the opening of the Construction Innovation and Technology Application Centre (CITAC). The HON Paul CHAN Mo-po, GBM, GBS, MH, JP, Financial Secretary of HKSAR, Mr. LIU Chun-san, JP, Under Secretary for Development, Ir HON Chi-keung, JP, Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), Mr. CHAN Ka-kui, SBS, JP, Chairman of CIC, and Ir Thomas HO, Chairman of CITAC Board jointly officiated the opening ceremony, marking an important milestone in the development of construction innovation and technologies in Hong Kong.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, The HON Paul Chan Mo-po, said that innovation and technology are of utmost importance to the development of every industry, especially the construction sector. He hopes that the local construction industry will actively innovate and adopt new technologies to enhance competitiveness. He added that the government will continue to allocate resources and cooperate with the industry as to create an environment conducive to the development of technologies and innovations.

As one of the CIC's sustainable initiatives, CITAC is committed to promoting the application of innovative techniques and solutions in the local construction industry with a view to providing the industry with cutting-edge information on homegrown and overseas-developed building technologies. CITAC also aims to improve the productivity of small and medium enterprises with the education and adoption of innovative construction methods, hence preparing the industry for "Construction Industry 4.0" in the near future.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, Mr. CHAN Ka-kui said, "In recent years, the construction industry is plagued with the challenges of rising construction costs and productivity slowdown. According to the 2017 Global Competitiveness Report released by the World Economic Forum, Hong Kong is ranked 6th in overall global competitiveness index, jumping 3 places from last year, but in terms of the 'innovation' pillar, Hong Kong is ranked 26th. Despite having world-class infrastructure, the lack of innovative forward thinking will definitely hinder further development of Hong Kong."

Ir Thomas HO said, "CITAC serves as a knowledge hub to showcase the local and overseas innovative construction technologies. We would like to encourage the industry to be courageous, identify innovative techniques and technologies that are applicable in Hong Kong, collaborate and co-create, thus facilitating sustainable development of the industry."

CITAC is located on the ground floor of the CIC Kowloon Bay Training Centre. Apart from exhibiting the foremost construction technologies, CITAC will also organise regular seminars and forums to promote the information exchange among construction practitioners. In the near future, CITAC will develop an online e-directory which will house the latest innovation information, relevant case studies and contacts of suppliers. The e-directory will provide visitors a convenient access to information on business support and training programmes.

CITAC's inaugural exhibition is divided into five different thematic zones, namely "Industrialisation", "Informatisation", "Intelligentisation", "Integration" and "Infinity". The current exhibition has more than 30 construction innovations on display. CITAC will organise guided tours which is opened for booking for members of the construction industry and public.
