## **Construction Industry Council Extends the Waiver of Construction Workers Registration and Renewal Fees**

**Hong Kong** · **26 May 2022** – In response to the extension of existing waivers/concessions of government fees and charges for an additional year as announced by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region on 18 May 2022 to ease the operating pressure of businesses in face of the epidemic, the Construction Industry Council (CIC) announces that it will extend the waiver of construction workers registration and renewal fees for another 12 months from 1 October 2022 to 30 September 2023.

This fee waiver measure aims to show our support to frontline construction workers and is expected to benefit about 120,000 workers, costing around HK\$9 million. Together with the waiver implemented since 1 October 2019, the CIC will waive the relevant fees for construction workers for four consecutive years in total with a sum of approx. HK\$38 million. The registration of construction workers is valid for a 5-year term. Workers can renew their registration 6 months before the expiry of their current term.
