# Construction Industry Council Supports the Government's Action Against Contractor Involved in Site Safety Incident Adherence to Safety Management Principles

**Hong Kong • 19 October 2023 -** The Construction Industry Council (CIC) supports the government's serious actions against the renewal application of a contractor involving in industrial accidents. A contractor involved in a fatal incident at a construction site in Yau Tong in December 2022, Aggressive Construction Engineering Limited, will be removed from the Government's Register of General Building Contractors starting from 16 November 2023.

According to the Buildings Ordinance, the Buildings Department was not satisfied with the authorised signatories of the contractor in respect of their competence in site supervision and safety management matters, with careful consideration on the recommendation of the Contractors Registration Committee after interviews and assessment. Hence, the Buildings Department refused the contractor's application for renewal of registration.

Construction safety and built quality are always our top priorities while we forge ahead industry development. The CIC appeals to the industry to adhere to "Life First, Say No to Danger" and "Everyone is accountable to construction site safety". By encouraging stakeholders to take up safety roles and responsibilities, the CIC strives to drive a transformation of site safety culture to enhance construction safety.

The CIC encourages the industry to review construction site safety procedures and its operations, utilise technologies with the adoption of Smart Site Safety System (4S), Modular Integrated Construction (MiC) and construction robots, etc., to enhance construction site safety, productivity and sustainable development.
