The CIC Imposed Regulatory Action Against Registered Company under the Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme in Relation to a Fatal Incident at a Public Housing Construction Site in Kwai Chung

Hong Kong • 20 March 2026 – The Construction Industry Council (CIC) considers "construction safety" as the cornerstone of industry development. In response to a fatal incident at a public housing construction site in Kwai Chung on 19 March 2026, the Committee on Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme (Com-RSC) of the CIC has immediately suspended the registration of a registered company concerned in accordance with the regulatory mechanism under the Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme (RSTCS). The subject company is the subcontractor responsible for tower crane.

The registered company concerned is required to conduct an independent safety audit to review its safety management system, submit an improvement plan based on the results of the safety audit and complete the implementation of the improvement measures for further consideration of the Com-RSC.

The CIC will continue to stringently follow up with any registered companies involved in serious incidents in accordance with the mechanism under the RSTCS.
