## **Background**

- CIC's long-standing commitment to promoting good practices in the construction industry [Assignment Brief 1.1]
- In line with this commitment, the CIC Standard Form of Domestic Sub-Contract ("CIC Standard Form") was published in February 2016 [Assignment Brief 1.2]



- Nearly a decade later, a comprehensive revamp is essential to ensure continued relevance and alignment with current industry needs and best practices, particularly the SOP Ordinance [Assignment Brief 1.3]
- Private sector projects still rely on varied in-house sub-contract formats—this revamp offers a
  timely opportunity to establish a unified, equitable, and practical sub-contract provisions that
  can achieve broader industry adoption [Assignment Brief 1.4]

#### The Task Force [Assignment Brief 1.5]

- Task Force on the Revamp of CIC Standard Form of Domestic Sub-Contract ("the Task Force") has been established under the Committee on Construction Business Development and Productivity ("Com-CBD&PRO") to oversee the revamp process
- The CIC Secretariat would render all necessary support to the Task Force and for this Legal Consultancy Services

#### Objectives [Assignment Brief 2.1]

- To undertake a comprehensive revamp of the CIC Standard Form to develop a unified standard form of domestic sub-contract. The revamped CIC Standard Form shall comprise:
  - (i) A **Main Booklet** containing
    - a set of revamped sub-contract provisions; and
  - (ii) A Supplementary Booklet containing:
    - Part A: A set of guidelines and/or guidance notes
    - Part B: A set of recommended good practices with ready-to-use template special conditions of sub-contract to implement these good practices

#### Requirements – General [Assignment Brief 2.2(a)]

#### Foundation and Benchmarking

- □ The existing CIC Standard Form will serve as the foundation, benchmarked against leading local and international standard sub-contract forms, such as:
  - Standard Form of Domestic Sub-Contract (2008 Edition) published by the HKCA
  - Agreement & Schedule of Conditions of Nominated Sub-Contract for use in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (2025 Edition) jointly published by HKIA, HKIS and HKICM

#### **Compliance and Alignment**

- ☐ Full compliance with the SOP Ordinance
- ☐ Address prevailing industry needs
- Balance interests of all parties to secure stakeholder buy-in and drive widespread adoption

#### **Equity & Clarity**

■ Balanced and proportionate between both contracting parties with clearly defined responsibilities and obligations

#### Requirements – The Booklets

#### **Main Booklet**

[Assignment Brief 2.2(b)]

 Sub-contract provisions shall be generalised to accommodate different forms of sub-contracts, enabling its application in both public works and private works projects

#### **Supplementary Booklet**

[Assignment Brief 2.2(c)]

- □ Part A Guidelines and/or guidance notes shall:
  - support the interpretation and practical application of the revamped sub-contract provisions in the Main Booklet
  - clarify key contractual concepts and procedures
- ☐ Part B Recommended good practices shall:
  - include good practices not specified in the Main Booklet but are considered beneficial for adoption, with a suite of ready-to-use template special conditions of sub-contract for opt-in implementation


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#### Scope


- Revamp both the English and Traditional Chinese versions [Assignment Brief 3.1]
- Given the diversity of perspectives, extensive and sometimes divergent comments are expected. Considerable effort will be required to review, consolidate, and reconcile stakeholder inputs to ensure a balanced approach [Assignment Brief 3.2]

#### **THREE Rounds of Amendment**



- Final Approval [Assignment Brief 3.3(j)]
- Two-stage approval process: Submitted to Task Force, then Com-CBD&PRO
- Attend TF meeting and Com-CBD&PRO meetings to present the Final Publication Version in July 2026 (subject to the final scheduled date)

**Note:** Throughout the Consultancy, comments from time to time received would be conveyed to the Contractor (Consultant) for consideration at the relevant stage. [Assignment Brief 3.3(k)]

Project Manager(s)	Senior Associate(s)	Minimum <b>7 years</b> of experience and any other relevant experience / equivalent qualifications subject to the CIC's approval
Technical Staff	Associate(s) / Solicitor(s)	Minimum <b>5 years</b> of experience and any other relevant experience / equivalent qualifications subject to the CIC's approval

- ☐ Profile of the law firm (10%)
- Composition of the Consultancy Team with respect to the availability, level of input, expertise and experience of qualified legal professionals (10%)
- □ Proven experience of the Consultancy Team members in providing legal services related to standard forms of construction contracts, with a focus on the Construction Industry Security of Payment Ordinance (Cap. 652) (40%)
- ☐ Outline Revamp Proposal (30%)
- ☐ Tenderer's Performance in CIC's Past Projects (10%)

## **Outline Revamp Proposal**

- Based on the tenderer's preliminary findings from a review conducted in accordance with Assignment Brief
   3.3(a) and its Annex, but it is not required to be as comprehensive as the full review
  - Comprehensive review of existing CIC Standard Form and SOP Ordinance
    [Refer to Final Report of the Consultancy Study on Review and Enhancement of Construction Contract Terms published by CIC in June 2025 as part of the review and note the issues requiring revamping]
  - Identify clauses require revamping, either through partial amendment or comprehensive overhaul, and propose any necessary new clauses that may be necessary to address the following:
    - Outdated clauses
    - > Clauses lacking enforceability or contractual robustness
    - Clauses with disproportionate risk allocation
    - ➤ New clauses or modification for compliance with SOP Ordinance
    - Omitted provisions
    - Other deficiencies or insufficiencies

Issues raised in 1st TF Meeting as requiring revamping:

- Payment
- Risk-sharing
- Contra-charge
- Variations and their assessment
- Extension of time and monetary claims in relation to extension of time

## **Outline Revamp Proposal**

- Meet the **requirements** set out in *Assignment Brief 3.3(c) and its Annex*, but <u>not to the same level of detail as required for the Consultancy Service upon appointment</u>
  - Revamp <u>Framework</u>, based on the existing version of CIC Standard Form, outlining the following with <u>rationale and justifications</u>:
    - > Which clauses should be revamped, and to what extent, how such clauses should be revamped
    - What new clauses should be introduced
  - Preliminary <u>Outline</u> of the Supplementary Booklet
    - > Part A: Guidelines / guidance notes on the revamped sub-contract provisions in the Main Booklet
    - ➤ Part B: Recommended good practices that could be promoted in domestic sub-contracting, along with the corresponding template special conditions of sub-contract to facilitate their opt-in implementation [For reference, CIC has previously drafted a set of good practices, enclosed in Annex A of the Assignment Brief]
