2.3	CIC/RSC/P/018/20 (for information)	<b>Updates on Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme Operations</b> As of the end of April 2020, there were 1,586 companies registered as Registered Specialist Trade Contractors (RSTCs) under the Registered Specialist Trade Contractors Scheme (RSTCS). (Last reported figure as of the end of January 2020: 1,570 companies).

2.4	CIC/RSC/P/019/20 (for approval)	<p><b>Enhance Operational Flexibility of the RSTCS and Related Complementary Measures</b> Members took note of the latest implementation status of the RSTCS and after considering the intent of registration requirements, approved to enhance the method of calculation of contracts amount of satisfactory track records and the corresponding amendments to the “Rules and Procedures for the Register of Specialist Trade Contractors”, while decided to maintain the existing requirement on long-term employment staff.</p> <p>About the implementation of sub-contract tendering limits over Group 1 RSTCs in public works contracts to be invited for tender starting from 1 October 2020 as originally scheduled, Members had deliberated on the number of registered companies, market condition and trades’ characteristics and conveyed their consolidated views to Development Bureau’s representative for further consideration.</p>
2.5	CIC/RSC/P/020/20 (for approval)	<p><b>2021 Detailed Business Plan and Budget</b> Members deliberated and endorsed the 2021 detailed business plan and budget. Finance Department would consolidate and submit all budgets and work plans of committees and departments for Council’s approval.</p>
2.6	CIC/RSC/P/021/20 - CIC/RSC/P/024/20 (for information)	<p><b>Regulatory Hearing</b> The second regulatory hearing of 2020 was conducted. A total of six companies were sanctioned with suspension of registration due to fatal site accidents and serious poor performance in the project involved in the Final Report of the Commission of Inquiry into the Construction Works at and near the Hung Hom Station Extension under the Shatin to Central Link Project.</p>
